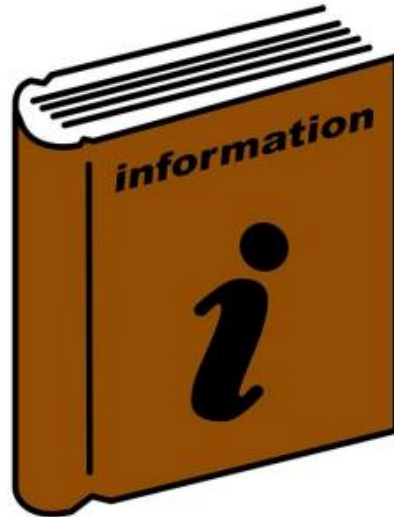
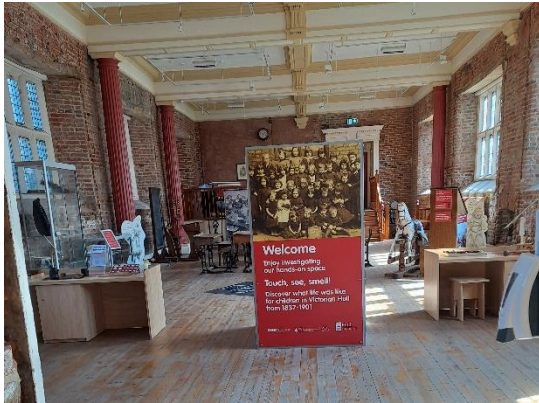


# Easy Read Guide

There is a multistory car park on Marketplace.



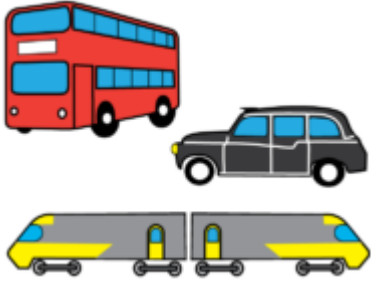

You can book a wheelchair accessible taxi by calling Wheelchair Taxi Transport Hull on 01482 473235.



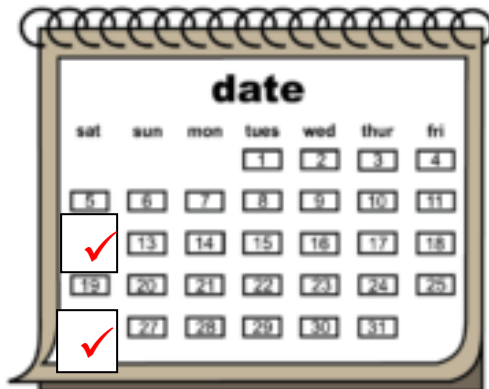
Our museum

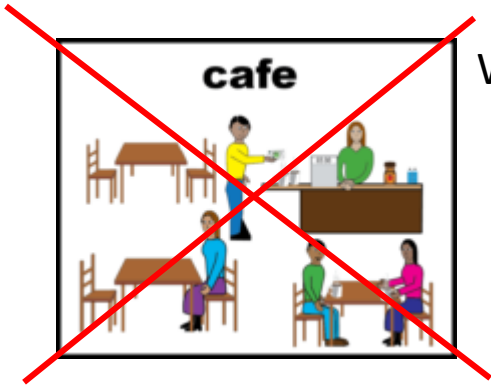


It is free to come to the museum.



The museum is open on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturdays of the month.





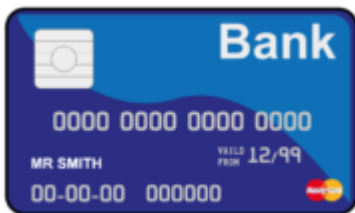
We don't have a café.



We do have a shop.



The shop only takes cash, not card.



Most of the ground floor is level access but these rooms are up or down some steps;





- The Victorian laundry (down steps)



- The storytelling area (up steps)



There is a ramp through the shop that takes you to the stairs and lift.



Assistance dogs are welcome

There is an Accessible Toilet on the first floor.



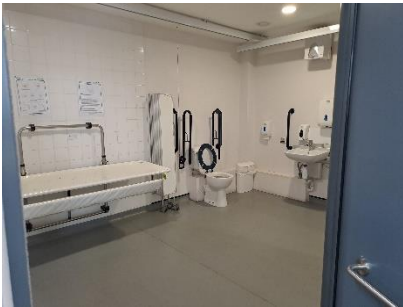


This toilet has a baby changing table and nappy bin.

## Changing Places Toilets



Changing Places toilets are larger accessible toilets for people who cannot use standard accessible toilets.



They have equipment like hoists, curtains, adult sized changing bed and space for carers.



Our nearest Changing Places Toilet is at Trinity Market.

We sometimes have relaxed craft sessions. These are disability-friendly sessions for people who would find busy sessions stressful.



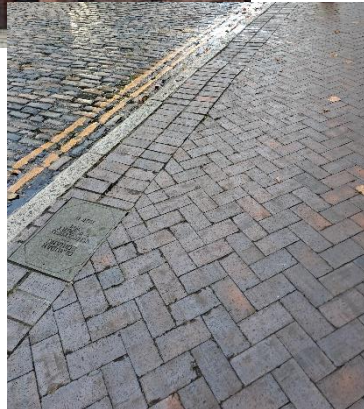

It is free to visit the museum.

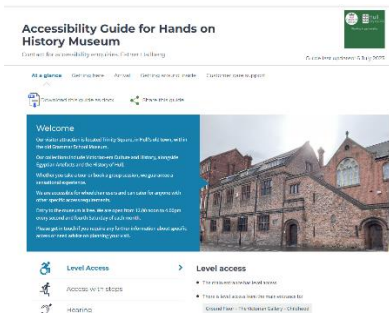


The museum is open on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Saturdays of the month.
