Wheelchair access and site plans

The areas the event is being held- the Hull Museums Quarter gardens, Streetlife Museum, Hull and East Riding Museum and Wilberforce House Museum, are all wheelchair accessible. Accessible Parking

Accessible Toilets and Changing Places Toilets

All of the museums have accessible toilets and baby change facilities. However, we do not have our own Changing Places toilet. The nearest Changing Places toilets can be found in the Guildhall on Alfred Gelder Street and in Trinity Market in Trinity Square. The Changing Places toilet in the market can be accessed via a RADAR key that you can pick up from any of the vendors.

Assistance Dogs

Assistance dogs are welcome at our all our sites. Water bowls for assistance dogs are available from the front desk of each site, please just ask a member of staff for one.



British Sign Language Interpretation

A number of the Victorian and Dickensian character performances and storytelling sessions at the event will be British Sign Language interpreted. Meanwhile, the Hull Visual Choir, who are giving musical performances both days, use British Sign Language in their performances.

Relaxed Craft sessions and storytelling sessions

On each event day, we will be running a relaxed craft session and relaxed storytelling session with limited numbers designed for children who have a disability, are neurodivergent or experience anxiety that. Quiet Room and quieter times for visiting the event

The event will be at its quietest 10am-12pm on the Saturday and 11am-1pm on the Sunday.

A Quiet Room with some sensory resources will be available in the Streetlife Museum for anyone who needs it. Please just ask at the Streetlife Museum front desk if you would like to access this space and someone will let you in.

Ear defenders and sensory resources

A small number of ear defenders and sensory resources will be available to borrow from the front desk of each museum during the event.

Portable stools

A small number of foldable, portable stools will be available to borrow from the front desk of each site for visitors who would fund it difficult to stand whilst watching the performances. Please just ask a member of staff if you would like to borrow one.
